1. **<u>Numeracy</u>**– Numeracy is the ability, confidence and willingness to engage with quantitative or spatial information to make reasoned decisions in all aspects of daily living.

 \Rightarrow KeyMath used to test many students in grades 3-8. Used the essential resources to target areas of challenge

 \Rightarrow Planning for next year underway including Grade 5-8 NAP assessment (Numeracy Assessment Project)



2. **Literacy** – The ability, confidence and willingness to engage with language in order to acquire, construct and communicate meaning in all aspects of daily living.
